- \* DR.MUST REMEMBER HIS DUTY TO THE STATE IN RELATION TO NOTIFIABLE DISEASES AND TO THE PUBLIC TO GIVE EMERGENCY CARE ON HUMANITARIAN GROUND.

- \* ETHICS –IS DERIVED FROM THE GREEK WORD ETHOS MEANS CHARACTER- CHARITRA
- \* HERE CHARACTER OF VAIDYA, DOCTOR, PHYSICIAN, HAKIM AND RMP.
- \* PROFESSIONAL ETHICS ARE THE CIVILCODE BEHAVIORS CONSIDERED CORRECT BY MEMBER OF THE PROFESSION FOR THE GOOD OF BOTH THE STAKE HOLDER AND PROFESSION.

- \* THE DUTY TO INFORM ABOUT NOTIFIABLE DISEASES TO STATE.
- \* TO GIVE EMERGENCY CARE ON HUMANITARIAN GROUND.
- \* THE DUTY TO CONFIDENTIALITY (GOPANIYATA) ABOUT PATIENTS.
- \* THE DUTY TO PROTECT THE LIFE OF PATIENTS ACCORDING TO AYURVEDA WE CALLED AS PRANABHISAR VAIDYA
- \* THE DUTY TO RESPECT THE PATIENTS OUTONOMY.

- \* EVEN UNDER THREAT I WILL NOT USE MY MEDICAL KNOWLEDGE CONTRAARY TO THE LAWS OF HUMINITY.
- \* I WILL GIVE TO MY TEACHERS THE RESPECT AND GRATITUDE WHICHIS THEIR DUE.

## P.M.E. CODE OF MEDICAL ETHICS OTH

- \* MY COLLEAGUES WILL BE MY BROTHER.
- \* THE HEALTH OF MY PATIENT WILL BE MY FIRST CONSIDERATION.
- \* I WILL MAINTAIN THE ULMOST RESPECT FOR HUMAN LIFE FROM THE TIME OF CONCEPTION.
- \* I WILL RESPECT THE SECRETS WHICH ARE CONFIDED IN ME EVEN AFTERPT IS DEAD.
- \* I WILL NOT PERMIT CONSIDERATION OF RELIGION, NATIONALITY, RACE, PARTY POLITICS OR SOCIAL STANDING TO INTERVEN MY DUTY AND MY PATIENTS.
